Art 5: July 16 - 20 | MEET THE ARTIST

This camp is for you! Explore every medium and create art inspired by artists new and old, the masters and the contemporary. Meet the greats and become the best artist you can be!

Art 6: July 23 - 27 | ART INVENTORS

If you had access to an arsenal of art supplies, what would you create? Would you invent a homework robot or a new board game? Unleash your imagination and use paint, clay and recycled materials to build prototypes for the next biggest invention!

Art 7: July 30 - AUG 3 | MIXED MEDIA MANIA

Explore the world of sculpture! Campers will begin to gain an understanding of basic building techniques while learning how to be expressive using clay, cardboard, paper, plaster, wire and much more. Mix up you materials and use a little bit of everything to create a wide range of 2-D and 3-D artworks.

Art 8: Aug 6 - 10 | STORYBOOKS & ILLUSTRATION

This week of camp is devoted to the world of stories. Using tall tales and picture books, campers will discover what it takes to illustrate a book. Campers will learn from illustrators like Jon Klassen, Chris Van Allsburg and David Weisner to create a style that is all their own. What's your story?

Art 9: Aug 13 - 17 | URBAN ART

Theater 1: June 18 - 22 | TINY TOTS THEATER (AGES 5-7)

Learn the basics of theater, play and dance along with the music and we will take what we lean, using our beginner reading skills, to bring our favorite storybook characters to life!

Theatre 2: June 25 – June 29 | JUST IMPROVISE Learn the ancient art of clowning around. In this silly week of camp, we pull out all the stops to put on a comedy show- with all the cues provided by the audience. We still use props and costumes, but we make the show up on the spot.

Theatre 3: July 23 – 27 | IMPROV EXTRAVAGANZA
Jump in, be big and bold, laugh, and learn the basics of acting through the wild, wonderful world of improvisation! Learn to think quickly on your feet and act from the top of your head in this fun, silly, and engaging camp. Students gain confidence in public speaking, expressing themselves using their body and voice and facing fears of stage fright and performance anxiety. Class culminates in an original improv show for family and friends written, created, hosted, and performed by the campers.

Theater 4 : July 30 – Aug 3 | PUPPETRYDo you love art and theater? This camp is for you! Create your own puppets, develop the characters, and build a show starring your creation, interacting with human actors! This week will culminate in a full "puppet show" in which campers will learn and apply beginner-level acting techniques.

Ceramics 1: June 18 - 22 | BEGINNER WHEEL THROWING

Build your skills with a week of camp devoted to the pottery wheel. Start by throwing the basic cylinder form and turning it into a functional bowl or vase. Add some character to the plates and cups you will create and can use every day with interesting surface techniques and glazes.

Ceramics 2: June 25 - 29 | CLAY CREATURE CREATIONS

Explore various basic hand building and texturing techniques while creating different creatures from your imagination. Each project will be glazed or painted to make your creature really come to life. This class will cover pinch, coil and slab construction to create a variety of projects from functional work to small sculpture.

Ceramics 3: July 2-6 | GARDEN ART

Whimsical bird baths, mosaic stepping stones, clay flowers that bloom all summer, or maybe a door to the fairy world? This week of camp focuses on building all things that beautify the great outdoors. Campers will learn basic hand building techniques to coil, pinch and sculpt, making this camp perfect for both the beginner looking to learn about clay, as well as the more advanced and imaginative ceramicist!

Ceramics 4: July 9-13 | CLAY PAINTING

Learn to transform 2D paintings into three-dimensional ceramic sculptures! Create works inspired by great master artists like Claude Monet, Pablo Picasso, and Piet Mondrian and reimagine it all in the world of clay! This camp will teach basic clay hand building techniques such as pinch pots, slab and coil construction and use underglaze, glaze and paint to explore the world of painting through the eyes of a sculptor!

Ceramics 5: July 16 - 20 | THROWN AND ALTERED

With a basic knowledge of the pottery wheel, campers can take their pots further! Slice them, add to them and build new forms to explore both wheel throwing and hand building at the same time. Build functional pieces as well as sculptural forms and use your imagination to create new and interesting ceramic work. *This is an intermediate level ceramics camp. Prior experience on the pottery wheel is required.

Ceramics 6: July 23 - 27 | SCULPT-O-RAMA

The sky is the limit in this clay based sculpture camp! How tall can you really build a coil pot? Can you make a dragon? Does a sculpture have to stand on the ground? What if it hangs from the wall or ceiling? Campers will learn about modern and traditional sculptures and design their very own three dimensional masterpieces.

Ceramics 7: July 30 - Aug 10 | RAKU CERAMICS

In this extended two week camp, campers will learn techniques from prehistoric clay working methods to the modern work of artistic ceramics, and everything in between. The first week is devoted to developing handbuilding skills, as well as learning technical aspects of clay, including where it comes from and how it's used, recycled and turned into a finished piece. During the second week, campers will explore different glazing and firing processes including the building, loading and firing of a traditional Japanese Raku kiln. Precautions are taken so that campers can have a safe and blazingly amazing time!

Ceramics 8 : Aug 13 - 17 | MAD HATTER'S TEA PARTY

So you have made a cup, but how about a whole tea set? In this camp, students will create a tea set fitting of the Mad Hatter himself. Here is your chance to make your pots as fun a whimsical as you possibly can. *This is an intermediate level ceramics camp. Prior experience on the pottery wheel is required.
